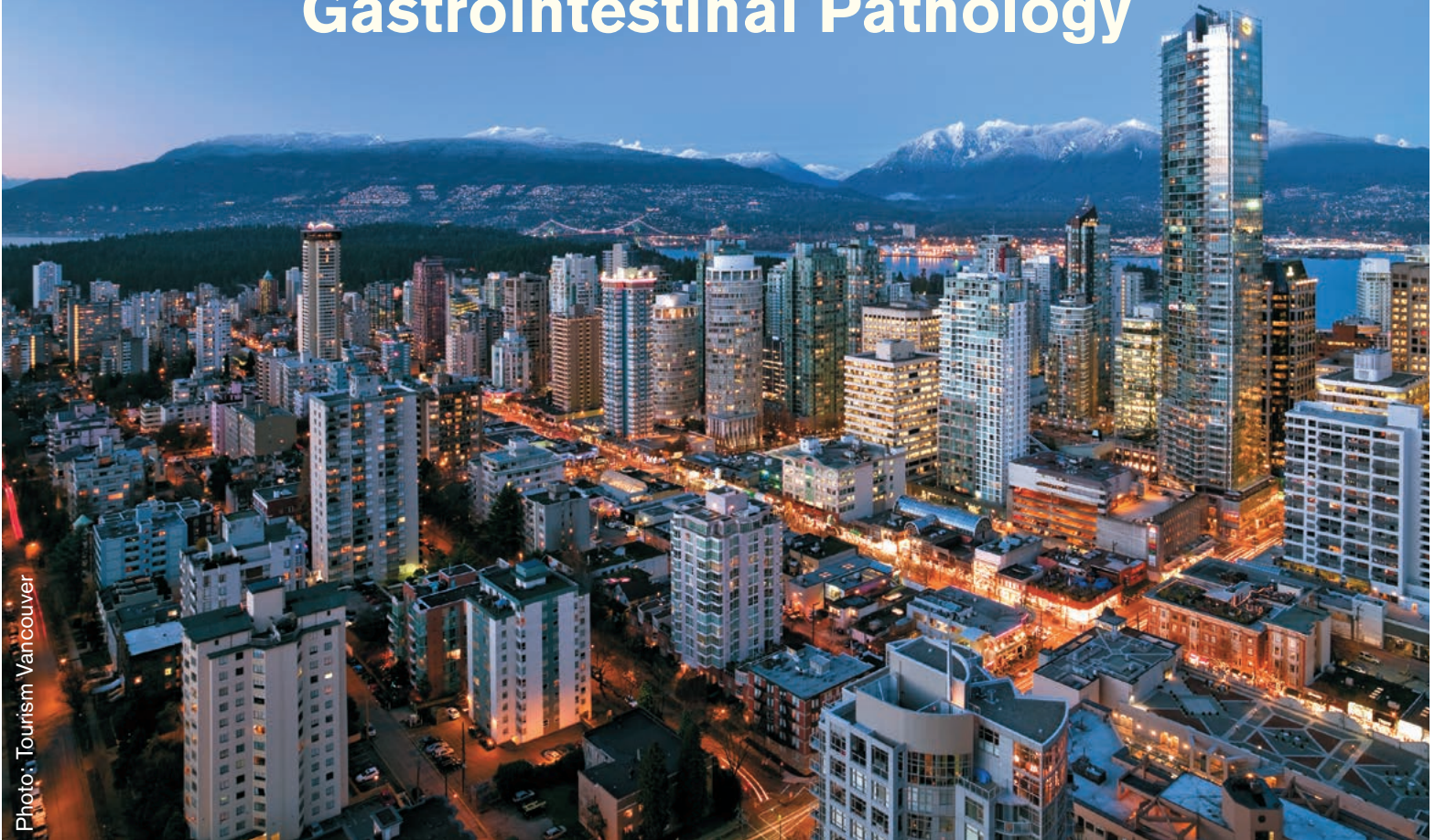

## ■ Learning Objectives:

- Recognize and describe criteria for separating dysplastic and non-dysplastic Barrett mucosa.
- Recognize and diagnose the importance of the location in GI tract samples as an aid to diagnosis.
- Diagnose and Identify clinically significant metastases.
- Recognize the range of patterns of injury associated with modern immunotherapy.
- Identify and define features that place patients at risk for pseudomyxoma peritonei.
- Recognize a systematic approach to inflammatory disorders of the stomach.
- Identify and recognize mimics of malignant colorectal polyps.
- Recognize and resolve differential diagnoses using both histology and clinical data, thus maximizing the impact of biopsy/resections.
- Identify and recognize the appropriate immunohistochemistry panel in pancreatic FNB specimens.
