## MEETING OBJECTIVES:

- Recognize that not all diseases in GI biopsies fit into a category, do not force or place into a category they do not belong.
- Identify histologic differences among the serrated polyps of the colon and rectum and apply this knowledge to your daily practice.
- Recognize and diagnose common gastric polyps.
- Describe evidence-based criteria to the interpretation of predictive markers and infer their relevance to novel practice settings.
- Re-evaluate the role of Immunohistochemistry in selected differential diagnoses and understand its clinical relevance.
- Describe the underlying assumptions that define the utility of Immunohistochemistry as a surrogate methodology.
- Identify and understand the limitations of Immunohistochemistry as a (semi) quantitative tool.
- Identify and broaden the differential diagnosis of common clinical diagnosis such as portal hypertension, cirrhosis and hepatic mass lesion using a combination of biopsy findings and available clinical information.
- Integrate genomics in pathology practice.

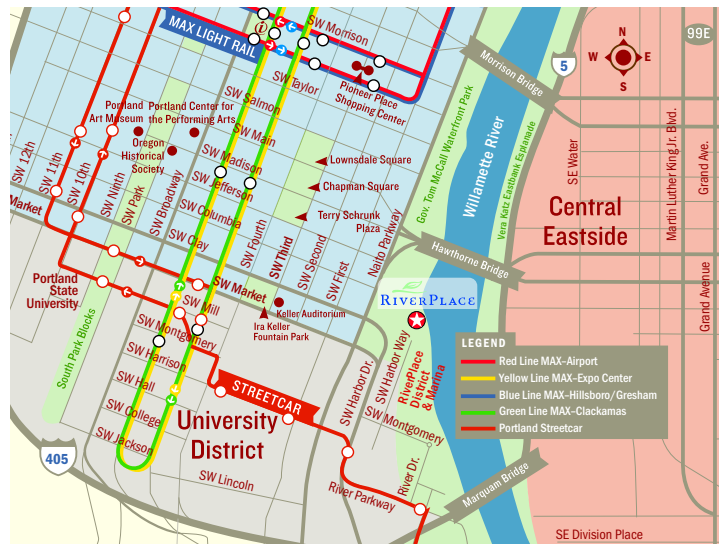
